

LOWRY AND THE SEA

25 May – 13 October 2024 Tues-Sun 11am-4pm Granary Gallery



Lowry is one of Britain's most recognisable artists, best known for his industrial landscapes. However, the sea was a constant presence in Lowry's life. During his childhood he enjoyed regular family holidays on the Lancashire coast. Later he travelled extensively throughout the British Isles and regularly visiting the North-East and its coast. He first visited Berwick-upon-Tweed in the mid-1930s and continued to visit the town until his death in 1976, perhaps drawn by its clear air and views out to the North Sea.

Lowry and the Sea explores the artist's connection to Berwick and his lifelong fascination with the sea. It includes works on loan from the The Lowry, Salford, The Arts Council Collection and several private collections and is the first curated exhibition of his works in the town for 10 years.







Berwick-upon-Tweed station is on the main East Coast line with frequent services between Edinburgh and Newcastle.

By Bus

By Car

Follow signs on the A1 to Berwick-upon-Tweed. From Marygate, enter the one-way system on West Street. Take the first left onto Easter Wynd, and into the car park in front of The Maltings.

Parking

The Maltings

Northumberland County Council operate the car park adjacent to the venue, with 52 spaces that have a time limit of 2 hours (no limit after 6pm). A display disc is needed to park here which can be purchased from our Box Office for £1 (cash only).

The Granary Gallery

Bridge Street car park is located next to the Granary Gallery which has 50 spaces and a time limit of 2 hours. Parking discs must also be displayed here.

The Gymnasium Gallery

There is a car park located a short distance away from the gallery at The Parade which has 78 spaces and a time limit of 3 hours. Parking discs must also be displayed here.
